After a great start to ACOM's 40th year in January 2020, our midwinter party took a 2-year "Pandemic" break, followed by a year with a cancelled in-person party. This year the party was on, finally, in-person, start date that but with a was close to Valentine's day.



ACOM had to locate a new venue for the party since the MidPointe Event Center closed down and the building was demolished. We were able to find an alternate location at the Cedarholm Community Room in Roseville. With easy freeway access, ample close-in parking, and ADA accessible, it turned out to be quite suitable for our event. The space is considerably smaller than our former venue, but not knowing what our attendance was expected to be, it fit the bill.

A crew of 15+ people helped in getting the new place ready the evening of the party, . Our total attendance was an incredible 100 people. This number included several Armenian students from St. Olaf College in Northfield hosted by Jim and Margaret Favre and Cynthia and Leroy Erickson. Our meal was catered by Mim's Mediterranean Restaurant in St. Paul and music for dinner and dancing was again provided by Music Mundial. Many of us had not seen each other in person for a few years, so it was espe-

cially significant for all of us to be present together. A silent auction was a resounding success, raising \$687 that helped defray ACOM's expenses. Thanks to all the donors and to the bidders on items.

Kudos to the ACOM Board, our setup helpers and to Naïry Digris who oversaw plans and execution for the event. A great time was had by all. Look forward to next year.









# ACOM held its annual Genocide Remembrance on April 23, 2023

This year, ACOM and the Minnesota Historical Society co-sponsored the event held in the 3M Auditorium at the Minnesota History Center main building, in the Capitol area of St. Paul.

This year's program was focused on the resilience of Armenian culture after the Genocide of 1915. Speakers covered various topics: housing, history, poetry, music, dance, language, alphabet and church architecture. The event was emceed by Steven Usitalo - ACOM President. More than 65 people attended and comments from the attendees after the event were very positive.

ACOM welcomes everyone, regardless of ethnic, religious, or political affiliation, who takes an interest in Armenia and Armenians. Our members include first-generation through fourth-generation Minnesota Armenians, their families, and non-Armenian friends of the community.

ACOM's numerous cultural and social events include Armenian dance parties (Gaghant), guest speakers, folk dance lessons and performances by the Armenian Dance Ensemble of Minnesota, Genocide commemorations, summer picnics, and series of Interviews of Presenters talking about their heritage. ACOM also sponsors all Armenian activities at the International Institute's Festival of Nations, a major regional folk festival held annually in St. Paul. Minnesota Armenians were founding participants in 1932; today, the Festival is ACOM's most visible public venue.

As an independent, 501 (c)3 non-profit organization, ACOM is supported primarily by membership dues and private donations. Gifts to ACOM are tax-deductible to the extent permissible by law.
